


WRITER IN RESIDENCE 2024

PRPL is pleased to announce that Robin Stevenson will be the library's Writer in Residence this fall, from **September 12 to October 26**.

Robin Stevenson is the award winning author of more than thirty books of fiction and non-fiction for kids and teens. Her books have won the Silver Birch Award, the Sheila A. Egoff Award and a Stonewall Honor, and have been finalists for the Governor General's Literary Awards, the Lambda Literary Awards, and many readers choice awards.

Robin was the Book and Periodical Council of Canada's Champion of Free Expression for 2022. In 2023, she was awarded the Lieutenant Governor's Award for Literary Excellence. She lives on the west coast of Canada with her family.











During the first weeks of her residency, Robin will visit ongoing PRPL programs like Storytime, Drawn Together, Young Writers Group, and Write On. She will also present at numerous schools throughout the qathet region in October. You can catch up with Robin at one-on-one manuscript consultations, workshops, and her ongoing Writers' Café on Friday afternoons!
